To ensure that you are entitled to funding, we will fully assess your eligibility prior to enrolling you.

Please ensure that you provide all prior qualifications held when asked to do so, as the college will retrospectively charge tuition fees should differing circumstances come to light.

Some courses are defined as full cost and as such do not qualify for free tuition.

Other courses are also not eligible for adult funding.

ABOUT ACCESS COURSES

WHAT IS ACCESS TO HIGHER EDUCATION?

The Access to Higher Education (HE) Diploma is a qualification that prepares students for university-level study. It's designed for people who would like to study in Higher Education but who left school without the usual qualifications, such as A Levels, or for those who have been out of education for a while

Many Access to HE students go on to succeed at university and beyond, with a large number pursuing new careers and seeing changes in their lives that they had never thought possible.

WHAT LEVEL IS AN ACCESS TO HE QUALIFICATION EQUIVALENT TO?

The Access to HE qualification is equivalent in standard to other Level 3 qualifications, such as A Levels, and has been recognised as a full Level 3 qualification in the Labour Force Survey.

CAN I GET FINANCIAL HELP TO STUDY?

Students aged between 19-23 without a full level 3 qualification may be entitled to get the course for free. Students who are aged 24 and over will have the option of applying for the Advanced Learner Loan or self-funding their studies. AM I TOO OLD?

No! Almost everyone considering an Access to HE course worries that they may have left it too late. Your life experience will be valuable on the course and you'll find that other Access to HE students and students studying at university level are of a wide age range.

People coming back into education are often extremely motivated, leading to a positive and productive learning environment.

WHAT DOES AN ACCESS TO HE COURSE INVOLVE?

To achieve an Access to HE Diploma, you need to complete a programme that includes certain units of study in relevant subject areas. You'll be taught preuniversity skills, learning how to approach study, and the different techniques that you'll need to be a successful degree student.

The whole package of units will have been designed to ensure that you're thoroughly equipped for studying at university. For each unit successfully completed, you'll earn credits that gradually build towards the 60 credits that are required for the Access to HE Diploma.

Many people are nervous when they start an Access to HE course, particularly if they haven't been in a classroom for some time. Tutors are aware of this and take it into account in their teaching. You won't be "thrown in at the deep end" or tested on things which you may have studied years ago. Though you can expect the course to be challenging, the whole purpose of an Access to HE course is to help you to be successful.

IS THE ACCESS TO HE DIPLOMA RECOGNISED BY UNIVERSITIES?

Each year, around 24,000 Access to HE students begin studying at universities across the UK. Access to HE is therefore widely recognised by UK universities.

Each year, around 20,000 Access to HE students apply to universities across the UK. What's more, the framework for the approval of Access to HE courses is managed by the universities' own quality assurance organisation: the Quality Assurance Agency for Higher Education (QAA).

ADVANCED LEARNER LOANS: KEY FACTS

- If your loan is for an Access to Higher Education course and you progress to complete a Higher Education university-level programme, you will not have to pay back your loan.
- You don't pay anything upfront.
 Repayments will start when your
 income is over £524 a week, £2,274
 a month or £27,295 a year. If your
 income falls below these thresholds,
 repayments will stop and only restart when your income is over these
 thresholds.
- You can make voluntary repayments at any time to pay off your loans more quickly.
- You'll be due to start repaying your loan in the April after you complete or leave your course.
- You'll repay 9% of your income over £27,295 a year. Even if your income doesn't exceed £27,295 a year but is over £524 a week or £2,274 a month at any point in the year (e.g. if you work overtime) then a loan deduction will be made.

- From the April after you finish the course, repayments are at 9% of income above £21,000, irrespective of the amount of loan taken out.
- Loans are not means-tested or credit-checked
- Outstanding loan balances will be written off after 30 years, from the completion of the course.

To qualify, you must:

- Be aged 18 or over at the start of the course.
- Be studying an eligible course (as per the funding policy).
- Have been a resident in the UK for three years prior to the start of the course.

APPLICATION PROCESS

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APPLY

The first step in joining Loughborough College is to **submit an application form**, this can be done online or via a paper form. After receiving this, we will acknowledge receipt of your application.

HAVE YOU GIVEN US ALL OF THE NECESSARY INFORMATION?

Predicted Grades - you need to provide us with your predicted grades so that we can ensure you are applying for a suitable course and level. For A Level applicants, where this is not provided your application will be put on hold.

Fee Status - We may ask you to complete and return a Fee Status questionnaire based on your Nationality or your right to remain in the country.

Are your course choices right for you? - where your predicted grades indicate that the course choice(s) are not appropriate, we reserve the right to amend this, where a suitable choice is available within the same area.



APPLICANT EVENT

In order to secure a place at Loughborough College, you must first attend an Applicant Event for your chosen course(s). Your invite will be sent via email so please ensure you check your spam/trash folders regularly.

Where you are unable to attend, it is important that we are notified beforehand (details on how to do this will be included in the email invite) so that we can invite you in to the next available event.

N.B. If an applicant doesn't attend two events in a row, without notifying us beforehand, then we will automatically assume that they are no longer interested and their application will be withdrawn.

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OFFERS

After attending an Applicant Event, the course leader will make a suitable course offer and this will be sent out to you. In order to secure a place on the chosen course, the acceptance of place form must be completed and returned to us within the **specified** timeframe.

Applicants who do not accept their offer may still be considered, however priority will be given to those who accepted their offer in the **specified** timeframe.

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PRE-PROGRAMME

In order to secure a place on the chosen course, students must then **attend** a Pre-Programme experience (taster day) OR notify us with a satisfactory explanation as to why they are unable to attend. These events are **likely to be** in **late June/early July** and they are really important for students to attend to enable them to get a taste of what being a student at Loughborough College is like.

Sadly however this event is not aimed at Parents/Guardians/Carers. Sorry - all the fun goes to our students for this one!

REGISTRATION AND ENROLMENT

First you will be invited to complete an Online Registration, where you will be asked to log in and provide us with your personal details. You must also provide us with ID evidence and an appropriate photograph of yourself for your student ID badge.

Then on National Results Day (Thursday 22nd August 2024) you will be asked to log in again and upload proof of your results. On, or shortly after, National Results Day you will be invited in to a Sign Up event with your chosen course area and this is where you formally sign up for your course. You will meet with a member of the teaching team who will assess your results and discuss appropriate courses.

If you do not get the grades that you are expecting then please don't worry! We will work with you to help you find an alternative option.
