

# ESPORTS JOURNALIST



A esports journalist is someone who gathers and analyses information to create content that's in the public interest. Journalists can publish on a wide variety of mediums, from newspapers to magazines, radio, TV and online – whether it's a written article or video/stream. Esports journalists may be required to write news stories, features, analysis articles, opinion pieces and match reports, as well as interview players and other people in the industry.

### HOURS

Journalism or content creation roles usually consist of a basic 40-hour week, but you'll be required to go above and beyond that, particularly if there's a specific event or announcement that needs covering on an evening or weekend, or if there's a deadline around the corner that needs to be hit.



### SALARY

A journalist earns an average salary of £24,271 per year. But remember, this is an average – don't be surprised to find junior positions that pay lower than £20,000. However, senior editors can earn anything from £25,000 up to £40,000 and beyond, depending on experience. on around £50-500 per month. There's the opportunity to earn more by offering one-on-one services too. Some streamers offer analysis services, charging anything from £20 to £100 or beyond for a report.
