

# OBSERVER



**An observer is someone who controls the in-game camera for esports broadcasts.**

**They will need to identify key plays, make sure the camera is highlighting the most interesting aspects of the match, and highlight replays for highlight reels. Observers work within the production team behind the scenes, liaising closely with the casters and broadcast crew.**

### HOURS

Observers will usually be called upon around specific events so may work on a part-time or freelance basis, but there are full-time positions too.



### SALARY

Salary varies. Most one-off jobs may pay around £150-250 per day, but top tier tournament providers could pay anything from £300 to £1,000 per day depending on experience, reputation, working hours and the size of the event.
